**Unapproved Minutes of July 21, 2022**

The Hay Township Board met on Thursday, July 21, 2022, in regular session. Supervisor Mudge called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer's Report was presented for June. Motion by Supervisor Mudge, support by Clerk Priemer to accept Treasurer's report. M/C.

Warrants/Payments: Monthly Warrants were reviewed. Motion by Trustee Becker, support by Supervisor Mudge to pay monthly warrants. M/C.

- Fireboard Report—Endre Sefcsik stated Hay Township had no fire runs for July. There was a mutual aid call Whitney Beach in Billings Twp.
- Ordinance Report—Old Complaints—1560 S. Whitney—Junk—Garbage around porch area has been cleaned up. 67 Lockwood—Junk—Some progress. Owner given until end of month to complete clean-up. 576 Laurel Drive—Blight—Demolition has begun. House being torn down today.
- New Complaints—Junk at W. Sun Oil and M-30—Complainant was referred to Buckeye Twp. supervisor. 2025 S. M-30—Long grass—Letter sent to owner requesting property be mowed.
- Constable Report—B & B, Riverhouse, and Dollar General were inspected last month and found to be in compliance with LCC rules.
- Greenways Inspection Report—Inspected business twice last month and will do so this month as well. In compliance.
- Old Business—Security Window & Office Doors; Trustee Becker gave update on windows and doors. Motion by Clerk Priemer, support by Supervisor Mudge to approve purchase of office doors with installation from Earl's Building Supply to be paid with ARPA Funds. M/C.

- **New Business—Resolution #7—Smallwood Lake Weed Control Assessment.**  
 Discussion. There is a technical need for an assessment for 2022 in the amount of \$259 and offsetting credit of \$259 from the funds on hand for a net assessment of \$0 for parcels included in the special assessment district. The December 2022 tax invoice will not indicate any amount due. This is the same process used last year. The assessment will be reviewed each year for increases or decreases of assessment amount. Motion by Clerk Priemer, support by Supervisor Mudge to approve the Smallwood Lake Weed Control Assessment Resolution #7. Roll Call Vote: Monaghan absent, Priemer yes, Mudge yes, Kludt yes, Becker yes. M/C.
- **Boyce Property Split—67 acres from parcel #110-015-401-001-03 to Gladwin County.**  
 Motion by Supervisor Mudge, support by Treasurer Kludt to approve the Boyce Property Split of sixty-seven acres from parcel #110-015-401-001-03 to Gladwin County. M/C.
- **Remove 2021 Garbage Assessment on parcel #110-035-303-001-10.** Motion by Clerk Priemer, support by Supervisor Mudge to remove 2021 Garbage Assessment on parcel #110-035-303-001-10. M/C.
- **L-4029 Approval; Motion by Clerk Priemer, support by Supervisor Mudge to approve the operating millage of .6524, the road millage of .7494 and the gravel road millage of .9986 per the L-4029.** M/C.

- **Supervisor Comments—Supervisor Mudge stated that because of the weed and tree growth South of the Dam, that the Wixom Lake Improvement Board would like to see residents added to the roll to cover the cost of weed and tree removal. Residents will be approached to see if there is any interest in the clean-up. Discussion followed.**  
**Drains—The Gladwin Record & Clarion published a list of all the drains in in the county and which townships they were located. Townships and residents will receive letters for amount due for the drains from the Drain Commissioner.**  
**FLTF will be meeting Tuesday, the 26<sup>th</sup> of July @ 5 o'clock. Location to be determined. Supervisor Mudge can be contacted for more information.**  
**The FLTF At Large Assessment for townships can be appealed, but appeal could cost Hay township approximately \$10,000. Supervisor Mudge will find out the percentage of successful appeals to determine whether we go forward with an appeal. If not appealed, Hay Twp. could pay approximately \$6300 a year for the assessment.**
