

HAY TOWNSHIP
Unapproved Minutes of August 18, 2022

The Hay Township Board met on Thursday, August 18, 2022, in regular session. Supervisor Mudge called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call: Monaghan present, Priemer present, Mudge present, Kludt present, Becker present.

Commissioner's Report: Karen Moore spoke of the issues at the Gladwin County jail. Cost approximately \$100,000 to fix the floor and pipes that had collapsed. There will be an ORV event Saturday, including a mud bog at the fair. There will be radio controlled planes on Aug. 27. The Council of Local Government meeting will be Aug. 29 at Beaverton City. Some of the ARPA fund projects are Calhoun Park, Economic Development, and a new roof on the Historical Society. On September 17 there will be a car show at the fairgrounds and Thunder at the Strip on Sept. 10 at the airport.

- **Fireboard Report—Timothy Saleski reported there were 2 fire runs in Hay Twp. One was a fire in the woods and the other was a downed powerline. Grout Twp. donated \$10,000 to the Gladwin Fire Department for a heat gun and turnout coat.**
- **Ordinance Report—Old Complaints—576 Laurel Drive-Blight—Job has been completed. Final bill and other expenses should now be forwarded to the district court for Judge's OK and addition to the tax bill. 67 Lockwood—Junk—This complaint began at the end of April. Since that time little progress as the junk boats are still there. I have issued the owner a citation for Violation of the Township Junk Ordinance. Checked the property today and still no change.**

- **Constable Report—B & B, Riverhouse, and Dollar General were inspected last month and found to be in compliance with LCC rules/regulations.**

- **Medical Marihuana Application Fee—Motion by Trustee Monaghan, support by Trustee Becker to accept a yearly fee of \$1200 for Greenways Medical Marihuana Application. M/C.**
- **New Business—Budget Amendment for Blighted Property Demolition # 101-101-957. Motion by Supervisor Mudge, support by Clerk Priemer to amend budget account # 101-101-957 for Blighted Property Demolition for an increase of \$4400. M/C.**
- **T.O.W.N. Grant Application. Motion by Trustee Monaghan, support by Trustee Becker to approve the T.O.W.N. Grant Application for \$2,000 to be paid if received, towards the purchase of a fire truck for the Gladwin County Fire Department. M/C.**
- **Public Comments—Karen Moore stated that Tobacco Township has a request on their November ballot for recreational marihuana facilities.**
- **Supervisor Comments—Supervisor Mudge stated there will be a FLTF hearing about the booms on Tuesday the 23rd at 10 a.m. at the Edenville Swanton Hall. The FLTF at large township assessment for the dams will not be litigated because of cost. The cost of the at large assessment to the township shall be approximately \$6300 a year for 3 years.**
